



## Coconuts for Romi

Romi has a job many kids want: tree climbing!

Romi works at a coconut farm in Indonesia. He harvests coconuts by twisting them off the trees.

It's not easy. It takes Romi a couple of minutes just to climb a tree. He cuts grooves in each tree to act as "steps."

Romi gets paid 125,000 rupiah, or \$11.80, every week.

It takes Romi all day to husk 250 coconuts. Husking, or taking off the hard outer shell, is the hardest part of his job.

At home, Romi is lucky; he gets a room all to himself. "I get to post pictures of my favorite movie stars on the wall, play my guitar, and even study without being disturbed," he says.

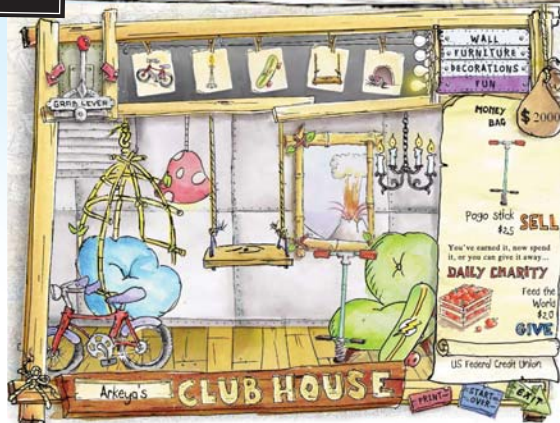
